
The Rite Stuff

Grit and Grins



Dr. Diane Noriega Earns Recognition as Patron Saint

Mt. Hood Community College congratulates Diane Noriega as the 2022-2023 recipient of the Patron Saint Award. This award is the highest honor given by MHCC to those who have demonstrated exceptional support of the college and its students through outstanding volunteerism and/or financial generosity.

When most people retire, they plan on spending more time gardening or traveling. Noriega saw her retirement years as an opportunity to invest more effort in higher education. "When my calendar went blank, I panicked. I was ready to say yes and ended up serving on several boards," said Noriega.

Noriega is a member of the Association of Community College Trustees Board of Directors and the Mt. Hood Community College Board of Education, a former MHCC Foundation Board member, and has been active in Rotary International. She holds a doctorate in education from the University of California, Santa Barbara and retired from her lengthy career in higher education in 2008 where she held roles teaching in all segments and in leadership.

Noriega is most proud her recent work with the Mt. Hood Community College Board of Education on the strategic plan and on diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI). Alumni Saint and District Board Member Andrew Speer Finds Inspiration on District Board Outcomes

ndrew Speer is a two-time Mt. Hood Community College alumni, his first time at MHCC was in 1998 as a 16-year-old homeschooled student. With his sights on joining the Marines, as soon as Speer could drive, he attended MHCC to earn college credits for high school equivalency—all in support of his military plan.

"In many ways, the college hasn't changed," Speer explained. "I see a few of the same instructors, and overall the feeling is still similar. It was interesting being in college at 16. The range of people in the classes was an interesting cross-section, I was in a math class with a 28-year-old and other students in my group were 19."

After four years in the military, Speer returned to MHCC in 2004 to study economics, math, and statistics. Like before, Speer had a plan, this time to earn a bachelor's degree from Portland State University (PSU). MHCC afforded Speer the ability to earn his prerequisites before transferring. He earned his bachelor's in

economics from PSU and stayed to earn his master's degree in economics in 2009.

Speer entered the workforce with a career in utility with Bonneville Power Administration, NW Natural, and at Portland General Electric applying rates and calculating pricing. He has also used his skills in local government affairs. As such, in 2019, Speer took an opportunity to give back to MHCC by joining the Mt. Hood Community College District Board of Education.

"The college has always been a big part of my life. I attended and so did my youngest sister. Plus, my mom received her nursing credentials in the '70s. The long connection brought me to ask how I could give back and wonder what the future could look like for MHCC," Speer said. "I looked at the board to see whose terms were ending and noticed a demographic aspect where members weren't as close in age to the students that were being served. I became interested then in wanting to help bring diversity of thought to the institution of the board."

"Watching the board as a collective incite institutional change over time is inspiring. I appreciate the engagement with community and the ability to be in other spaces to talk about specific outcomes. We are starting to narrow into the strategic plan and the connectivity to student needs. Making directional changes to meet these needs for broader reach for residents is inspiring!" - Andrew




