#### Update on BT to CIS transition

On January 15, 2020 MHCC decided to phase out the Business Technology program which is currently offered through the Business & Information Systems division. Some

courses with a Business Technology (BT) designator are similar to courses that we also offer as Computer Information Systems (CIS) courses. Should we maintain both, or consolidate these courses? The advisory council decided to operate and maintain at this time.
